



Home and Community Based Settings Final Rule HCBS-TBI Transition Plan Public Comment Sessions

Public Notice – June 11, 2014

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) issued a final rule for home and community-based setting (HCBS) effective March 17, 2014. All states must meet new requirements for home and community-based services and supports offered in provider owned and controlled residential and non-residential settings for those who are served by HCBS Program for individuals with **Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI)**

CMS expects all states to develop a Transition Plan for each waiver that provides assessment, strategies, and timelines for meeting the requirements of the new rules. The Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services (KDADS) would like your comments on this Transition Plan before it is submitted to CMS. The initial plan is a draft of the State's blueprint for how we will assess settings, ensure compliance, and transition individuals to compliant settings, if necessary. We will continue to seek public input, even after we submit the plan for final CMS approval.
